Support for review and reflection from 2020-2021 - considering the 5 key indicators from DfE, what development needs are a priority for your setting and your pupils now and why?

Key achievements to date until July 2021:

- Vast improvement in active playtimes through the use of more equipment that the children can use to play with and be active, children are moving more and being involved in team games at playtimes.
- PE leaders have been trained by PE Consultant which has helped to scaffold active playtimes.
- Gymnastics equipment purchased has enhanced the teaching of gymnastics across all year groups.
- Beth Tweddle Gymnastics company has provided vital CPD for staff and staff are now more confident teaching and delivering gymnastics sessions to their year group.
- PE t-shirts purchased for all children meaning more children are accessing PE regardless of background.
- Pupils have had the opportunity to work socially distanced with Freddy Fit who provided an active fitness workshop for all classes. This has raised the profile of PE in school.
- Commando Joe has provided outdoor, adventurous activities for each year group promoting resilience and survival skills.
- Taster sessions from Lancashire cricket have raised the profile of school sport.
- PE passport has been used to support staff with planning, teaching and assessment of PE.

Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:

- Continue to develop PE leaders to support other children with active playtimes and encourage children to be involved in sport.
- Participate in competitive sport inter and intra competitions this has not been possible due to COVID this year.
- Assessment of PE to be developed to ensure all staff are assessing and differentiating teaching of PE.
- Provide more opportunities to be involved in a range of sporting activities for children of all ages and abilities.
- Ensure all children have appropriate clothing for PE.
