

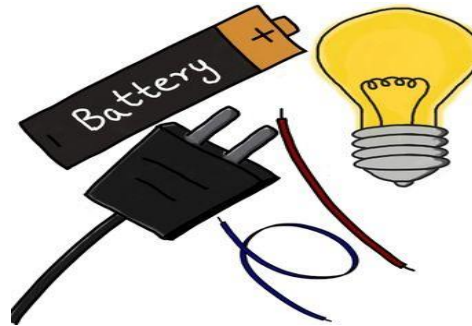

3.	The Parthenon is a temple in Athens that was built to honour the goddess Athena. It took around 15 years to build!
4.	The Ancient Greeks worshipped many gods and goddesses.

Switch	A power source that connects or disconnects a flow of electricity.
Power source	Energy transferred to an electric circuit.
Insulator	A material that does not allow electricity to pass through it.
Conductor	A device that can control the flow of electricity.
Battery	Used to power electrical objects.
Circuit	An electric circuit includes a device that gives energy to the charged particles.
Mains	Electricity supplied to a house through wires.

Battle	A sustained fight between large organized armed forces
