Support for review and reflection from 2022-2023 - considering the 5 key indicators from DfE, what development needs are a priority for your setting and your pupils now and why?

Key achievements to date until July 2022:

- Vast improvement in active playtimes through the use of more equipment that the children can use to play with and be active, children are moving more and being involved in team games at playtimes.
- Gymnastics equipment purchased has enhanced the teaching of gymnastics across all year groups.
- PE kit purchased for all children meaning more children are accessing PE regardless of background.
- Washing machine and tumble dryer installed meaning borrowed or lent out PE kit is clean, allowing more children are accessing PE regardless of background.
- Commando Joe has provided outdoor, adventurous activities for each year group promoting resilience and survival skills.
- PE passport has been used to support staff with planning, teaching and assessment of PE.
- Children have been able to compete in competitive sport inter and intra competitions.
- Year 5 sports leaders completed course and have taught active sports and activities to other year groups, inspiring others to be active and developing pupil leadership.

Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:

- Update and replace play equipment across the school to encourage active playtimes for all children.
- Continue to develop pupil-led leadership so they can encourage and inspire other children to be involved in sport, through supporting with active playtimes.
- Assessment of PE to be developed to ensure all staff are assessing and differentiating teaching of PE.
- Provide further opportunities for children to be involved in a range of sporting activities and competition, of all ages and abilities.
- Continue to develop children's mental health through physical activity.
- To provide more mental health resources across the school that promote activity and encourage active lifestyle choices.
- CPD yoga training for staff, to assist in improving mental health and mindful activity across the school, for all staff and pupils.
- Educate staff around inactive children and implement ways to tackle this within the school timetable.
- Provide gymnastics CPD for staff to enhance the teaching of gymnastics across all year groups.
- Additional CPD and PE passport training in EYFS to create consistency and links with KS1.
