## Key achievements to date until July 2023:

- CPD delivered to midday staff on organising games at lunchtimes.
- CPD delivered to teachers around active learning, targeting inactive children within the school timetable.
- Evidence of active learning in all classrooms on a weekly basis.
- PE passport continues to be used to support staff with planning. teaching and assessment of PE.
- Increased number of inter and intra sports competitions and festivals throughout the year which pupils of all year groups have engaged with.
- Year 5 sports leaders completed course and have taught active sports and activities to other year groups, inspiring others to be active and developing pupil leadership.
- Sports day carousel proved successful, allowing more inclusivity and engagement across both key stages.
- Wider opportunities provided to partake in a range of sports including parkour, swimming, cycling and handball.
- Bespoke outdoor interventions have promoted resilience, boosted mental health and improved wellbeing.
- Awarded Silver School Games mark.

## Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:

- Assessment of PE to be developed to ensure all staff are assessing and differentiating teaching of PE.
- Teacher CPD around PF differentiation.
- Opportunities for reluctant and inactive children to participate in intra competitions.
- Build staff confidence in delivery of dance and gymnastics.
- Continue to develop children's mental health through physical activity.
- Provide more mental health resources across the school that promote activity and encourage healthier lifestyle choices.
- Update and replace play equipment across the school to encourage active playtimes for all children.
- Continue to develop active learning in subjects beyond PE.
- Ensure access to forest school and Commando Joe sessions for all year groups, including SSC.


