Acorn


This half term, Big and Little Acorn have taken part in some PE sessions together.




Year 4

Gregg's Fund

As many of you will know we are supported as a school by the Greggs breakfast club. This has been a hugely popular addition to the school day and has seen over 60 children take part, with often up to 40 children a day joining us for breakfast.

In addition to the free breakfast club, the partnership with Greggs allows us access to a fund that supports our whole school community. These grants provide individual items that can make a huge difference to family life. These include white goods for domestic use such as a washing machine, fridge or cooker. They are also able to support with single, double or bunk beds including mattresses and bedding. We are also able to apply for smaller kitchen appliances such as a kettle, toaster or airfryer.

We have already been able to provide beds and mattresses for several families ensuring a better night's sleep for children, getting them rested and ready for school. Several parents have benefitted from washing machines, cookers and fridge freezers. There is only one application per family per year allowed so please prioritise the item you need the most.

Uniform
