#### Year 2



Little Acorn joined us and it was so much fun. We had to have a lot of patience and share the resources which we did amazingly.



### Attendance

Children who have attendance less than 90% are classed as persistent absentees. Children who are persistently absent generally do not achieve as well as their peers who regularly attend school.

Persistent absentees who have further time off school may be issued with a penalty notice by the local authority.



#### Science Week

Last week, Barton Clough Primary School took part in National Science Week. The children worked with a different adult each afternoon to carry out an experiment from start to finish, meaning that they got to work scientifically, as well as getting to know some different staff across school. Here's what some of our pupils said about the week:

I enjoyed making ice-cream. It was tricky as the bag leaked but we ended up with lovely ice-cream to eat. I learnt that adding salt lowers the freezing point of water, making it easier to make ice cream before the ice melts!



I liked making lava lamps with Miss Kennedy. I learnt that oil floats on top of water!

We made egg zip lines and tried to make them as fast as possible. I learnt that if you add more weight to the zip line, it travelled faster!





I enjoyed the catapulting jelly babies activities. I know I could do it at home by myself. I learnt that changing the length of the arm changes how far the jelly baby flies.
